Faculty Selections of Six and Potential

## Leadership

In one of the most moving campaign speeches ever given on a high school campus, KEN PRESTON won the heart of the student body and the presidency of the student council, the result of 3 years of service and leadership. Under his direction, the council took steps to establish the first book store. Ken has been president of the junior and sophomore class, treasurer of NHS and Student Council, director of Interact's guidance dept. program, and Boys' State Representative. He has lettered in football and track, organized a local philosophy club (of which he is president) and is an AFS brother to Heinz Huesser.

Scholarship

Selected as the outstanding student her freshman year and junior year, JUDY FRIEDRICK has compiled an enviable record of service and maintained one of the highest scholastic averages. Her cheerful disposition has made her one of the friendliest personalities in the leadership position which include chaplain of the Student Council, secretary and vice-president of the Future Teachers Club, vice-president of NHS (of which she has been a member for three years) and treasurer of the mixed Glee Club. JUDY has been active in the German Club, Philosophy Club (of which she is secretary), and the AFS Student Committee as one of the major planners of the 1969 summer bus stop. Judy was honored this year as a nominee for the NHS National Scholarship.

Scholarship, character, leadership, and service are the criteria for admission in the National Honor Society. Inductees are considered by a screening committee on the basis of grade averages (A for sophomores, B for juniors and seniors, and any F is immediate disqualification), faculty recommendations, and extracurricular activities. NHS is a service organization and its members can be summed up in one word: involvement. Honor Society has for several years offered such services as tutoring (in any subject), keeping students abreast of school events and 'Peanuts' cartoons with the bulletin board, ushering for every event in the auditorium, and sponsoring College Night, where over 200 students met representatives from over 20 Alabama colleges. This year, NHS offered with Interact Club, the first scholarship for CHS seniors exclusively. The scholarship was established on a permanent basis, amounting to roughly $\$ 1000$. In addition to their regular school services, National Honor Society members found time to publish the Alabama Honor Society Bulletin for all state chapters of NHS.

As their major contribution to CHS this year, INTERACT, in conjunction with NHS, originated the first sizable scholarship ever to be offered exclusively to Cullman High seniors. Other activities included: building the homecoming bonfire, sponsoring the AFS summer bus stop picnic, handling the Miss Southerner Pageant stage decorations and publicity, and donating a complete college catalog library to the guidance department. Community projects ranged from aiding Red Cross to work at the retarded children's day school to groundwork for an extensive recreation project to helping at a St. Bernard Sorority Day. All totaled INTERACT spent over 5000 dollars and man-hours in over 35 projects in 1969-70.
