


SOUTHERNER STAFF CHOOSES THEME



That's right! Little did students know that as they roamed the halls between (and during) classes Cullman Senior High School was approaching three decades full of higher learning.

Way back in the late 1950's someone realized that Cullman City School (now known as Cullman Middle School) was becoming crowded. At that time grades kindergarten through twelve were

combined in one school.

Plans got underway for a new Senior High School. Even though the cost was estimated to be \$1,300,000, which was a lot of money at that time, architects designed a school to serve an enrollment of 900 students. The lunchroom, auditorium, and gym provided for 1800 people. Although only fourteen classrooms existed in the original plan (five English, five social studies, and four math), the spacious eighteen acres of land had enough room for at least eighteen more classrooms — maybe even twenty-nine! The football stadium, considered one of the most modern in the South, featured an enclosed lighting system to give even and shadowless illumination in all areas. The students' parking lot provided space for 400 cars.

Today, CHS has expanded to at least thirty-nine classrooms, several work shops, a guidance center, and of course the lunchroom, auditorium, and gym. Even more rooms are needed as technology advances and m ore equipment is acquired. Who knows? Ten years from now CHS might not even have a quad!












Not everyone was satisfied with the results. Shannon

The Freshman class of 1991-92 began its high school career by making a name for itself. The question is, "What is that name?"



Staff members juggle social and school lives to keep DEADLINES AND COMMITMENTS

T he yearbook has many purposes. Many people think of it only as a memory

book, but it also serves as a history book, resource tool, and an advertising medium for local businesses. To accomplish all this, a staff of CHS students is chosen each spring. Upcoming juniors and seniors apply for the 12 to 17 positions on the staff which are picked by long-time sponsor, Mrs. Elaine Williams.

"I look for students who are dedicated, conscientious, creative, and able to work well with others," says Mrs. Williams. "This year 14 girls and 3 boys were picked to take on the task of creating the 1992 Southerner."

Planning begins during the first few weeks of school. The entire staff chooses a theme that represents that particular year's student body. After that, it is up to the 7 "sections" of the staff to carry the theme throughout the book. Each section plans around the theme while developing a uniqueness that separates it from the other sections. The planning is followed by sketching, writing, picture taking, designing, rewriting, and finally, handing the finished product in for Mrs. Williams' approval. Then the pages are sent to a company in Dallas for publication.

As deadlines draw close, the staffroom becomes a blur of activity as members rush to finish their assigned pages. All sorts of problems must be solved such as misplaced pictures and stressed-out staffers and advisors. If deadlines are missed, the yearbook does not return in time for graduation.

In February, the staff breathes a sigh of relief as the last deadline is met. Many people don't realize that the yearbook is finished this early in the year. After the final deadline, remaining tasks include corrections on the page proofs and the distribution of the yearbooks. Before it gets into the hands of a student, each yearbook is checked for missing and upside down pages.

Editor, Beth Michael comments on this year's book: "This year we chose a workable theme that we hoped would make the 1992 Southerner stand out from previous years. We added more articles and dedication which together tremendously improved the book." Advisor, Mrs. Williams agrees, "This year's book is the best one we've had since I've been here."

National Merit Scholars

National Merit Scholars' selections are based on scores from the PSAT/NMSQT taken in the fall of the junior year. Fifteen thousand semi-finalists are announced in the fall of their senior year. These people scored in the top one-half percent of their state. Semi-finalists have an opportunity to advance to the next level in the competition for some 6,100 Merit Scholarships, worth approximately \$26 million. A list of Semifinalists and Commended Students (those who scored in the top five percent in their state) is sent to all colleges and universities in the nation.

Girls' and Boys' State participants are selected by a teacher committee each spring. Interested juniors submit a short essay explaining why they would like to participate. The committee then picks two or three boys (depending on class enrollment) and one girl. The boys attend a week-long session at Samford University where they are involved in several political exercises. The girl attends a similar session at Huntingdon College in Montgomery.

state tournament in '91.


















BOYS' TENNIS



IN THE NEWS, 1992 AMERICA WINS THE COLD WAR:

August 19, 1991: A date to remember. On this day the Soviet Union began a long trip into turmoil. News stations all over the world announced that Mikhail Gorbachev, the leader of the Soviet Union, had become "ill" while vacationing in Crimea. His vice president, Gennadi Yanaev, was taking over his duties. How strange it seemed that the public was never told where Gorbachev was during his sickness or what kind of disease he had acquired. It was easily discovered that a coup was taking place. The question still remained, however; who was responsible?

The state of emergency was imposed by a junta consisting of the prime minister, the heads of three security services (defence ministry, KGB, interior ministry), and representatives of the armed forces in the Soviet Union. The timing of the coup made clear its purpose. On Tuesday of that week, Mr. Gorbachev intended to sign a new union treaty. That treaty would have delegated nearly all significant central government powers to the republics which would be recognized as "sovereign states." For many Soviet leaders, this was too democratic. Gorbachev's glastnost plan was "bad" enough.

Although the day of the coup was probably decided some time in advance, it was poorly planned. It was six hours after the announcement of Mr. Gorbachev's illness before tanks appeared on the street. When the rifle division and airborne division finally arrived, it was an uncoordinated jam. Also, Soviet leaders were not willing to shed their own peoples' blood, which is what it takes to destroy opposition when attempting to pull off a successful coup. The only person of significance arrested was Gorbachev.

Enter: Boris Yeltsin, Russia's President. Mr. Yeltsin went to his parliament building, denounced the coup, and called for a general strike. Before he did this, Yeltsin had broken none of the committee's decrees; when he did, it was too late to arrest him. With Yeltsin opposing it, the coup began to lose control. The junta even lost control of its own media.

It was not long before Gorbachev suddenly reappeared, well again. Yeltsin took over, and Gorbachev was shunned away. The republics which form the Soviet Union began to withdraw, one by one, until there was no Union left. There was less and less food to buy. People would wait in line for hours, many times only to get nothing to eat. An anxious world waited to see what would become of the Eastern continent and if Russia's people would starve during the winter.







WILLIAM KENNEDY SMITH VERSUS PATRICIA BOWMAN: The Kennedys continued to stay in the spotlight this past year when William Kennedy Smith was accused of rape. His accuser, Patricia Bowman, claimed he raped her on the beach in front of Smith's Florida beach home. It was difficult to find an unbiased jury because the trial was publicized on every major network. After the trial began, CNN displayed the complete trial but kept the victim's face blotted out (so that her identity would not be revealed). Upon Smith's judgment of "not guilty," Bowman came forward to let the public know who she was and to relate her complete story to the press.

SUPER BOWL XXVI

On January 26, 1992, the Washington Redskins played against the Buffalo Bills. The Bills proved that they had been poorly placed when the Redskins scalped Buffalo in the first quarter. Buffalo never got the lead. The final score was Washington, 37, Buffalo, 24.




THE ATLANTA BRAVES

Earvin "Magic" Johnson announced his retirement from pro basketball in 1991 because he had become infected with the HIV virus — the virus that causes AIDS. A saddened country watched as one of the greatest basketball players said his goodbyes to his first love. Many people hailed Magic as a hero, a role model for children. Magic became an AIDS ACTIVIST

and openly criticized President Bush for not doing enough about AIDS. However, others said Johnson was a hypocrite. Lewis Grizzard, a famous journalist from Georgia, said, "Find me a megabucks superstar who could have sexual partners by the U-haul trailer load, but who chooses not to, because it's 1992 and you can't do that kind of thing anymore. There's the hero."

Upon the fiftieth anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor, a Japan-bashing era began. Most Americans blamed the Japanese for the American economy sliding into a recession. On the other hand, some economists blamed the American people themselves along with the government for lax trade laws with Japan and other foreign countries. The recession scared many people into saving

their money instead of spending it. Profits for businesses during the Christmas season were at an all-time low because of fear of another Great Depression.

Attempting to satisfy the American people, President Bush attended summit meetings with Japan to discuss trade. During the long-awaited-for talks, Bush "tossed his cookies" and was subject to several jokes on the homefront.
