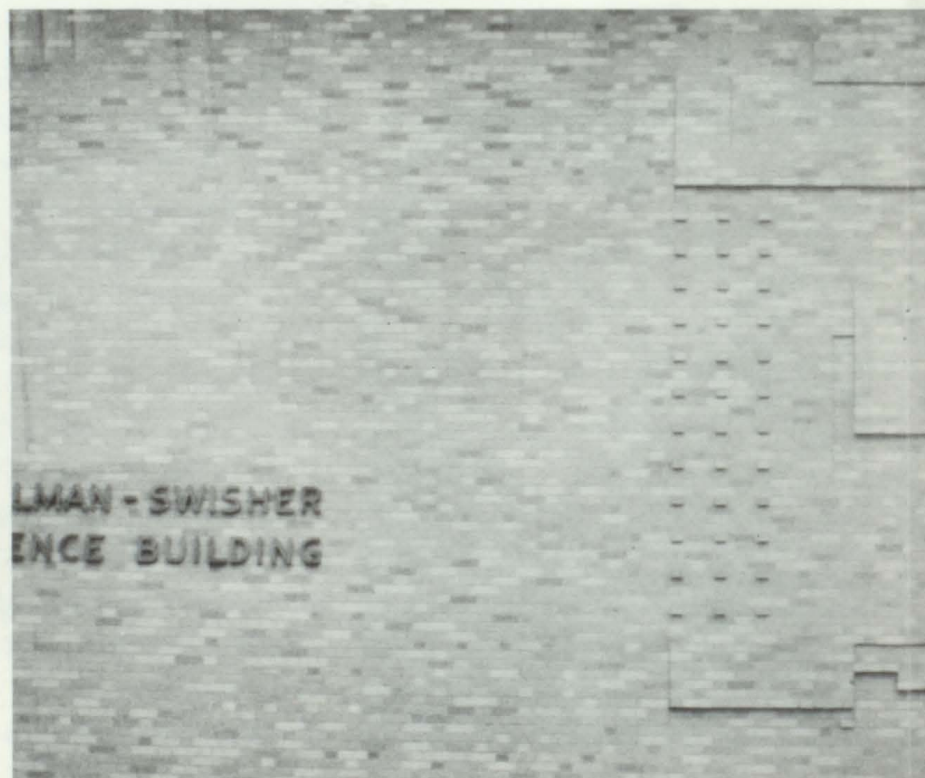
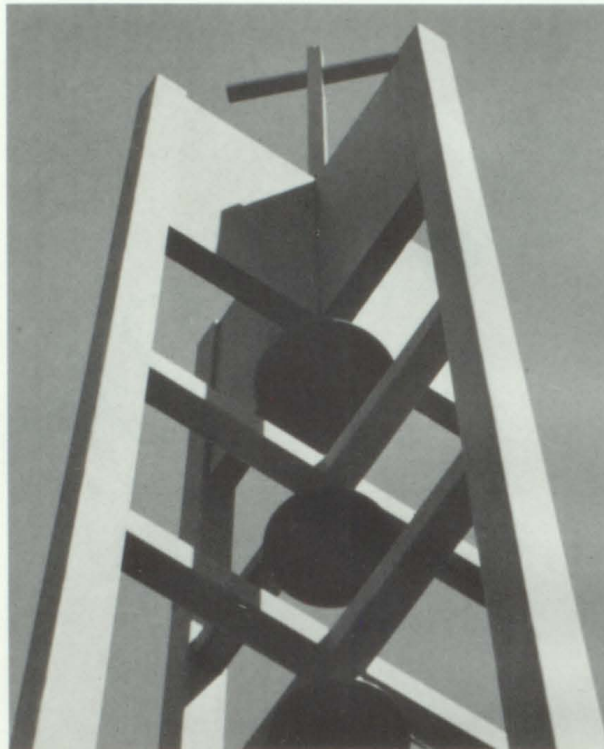
Saint Bernard

Although the monks of Saint Bernard Abbey have operated a school for almost a continuous span of one hundred years, 1993-1994 marks the **TEN**th year of the incorporation of a preparatory school. Beginning with a student body of thirty, enrollment has grown to 120. The faculty and staff began with people; that number has grown to twenty-four.

Many other important changes occurred this year. Perhaps the most drastic happened under the **poTENT** hand of returning librarian, Sr. Mary Ruth Coffman. She has been guiding SBP through a self-study for Southern Association accreditation. This process should last two years and will involve outside advisors, a number of committees, and paperwork in the **TEN**fold.

Another change is that an art department has been added to SBP under the **TEN**der wing of Mrs. Ginas. Classes include art history and practical applications.

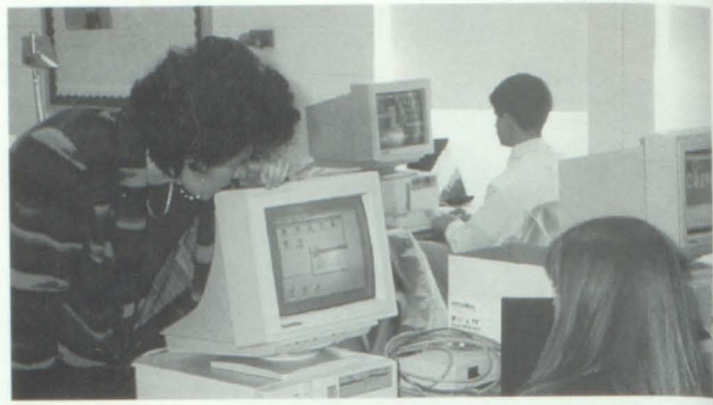

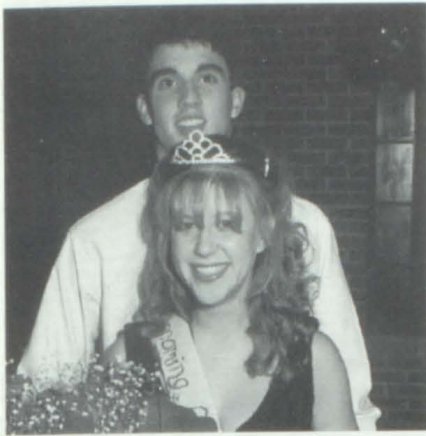

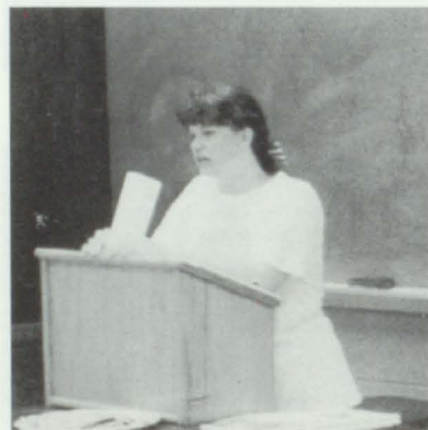
## *Interact*

*A large number of students are active in Interact. The thirty-two members collectively sponsor a Haitian child.*

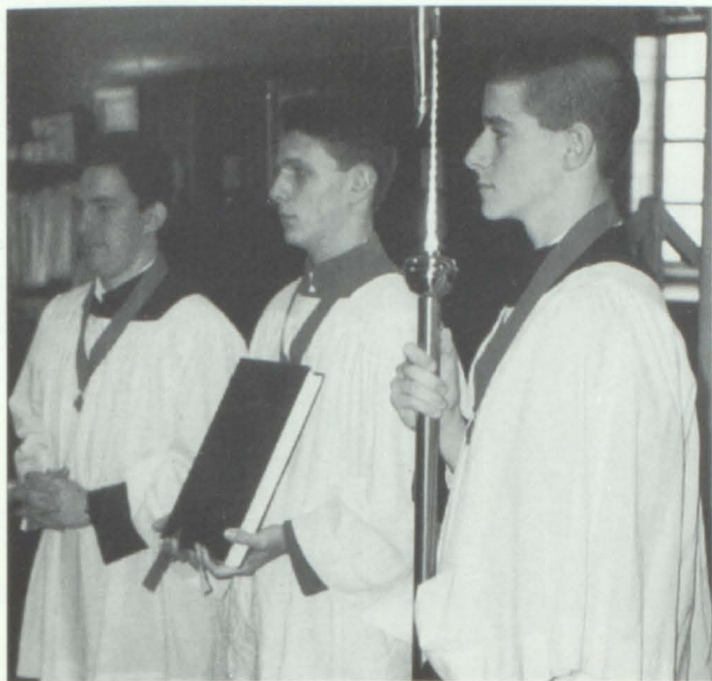

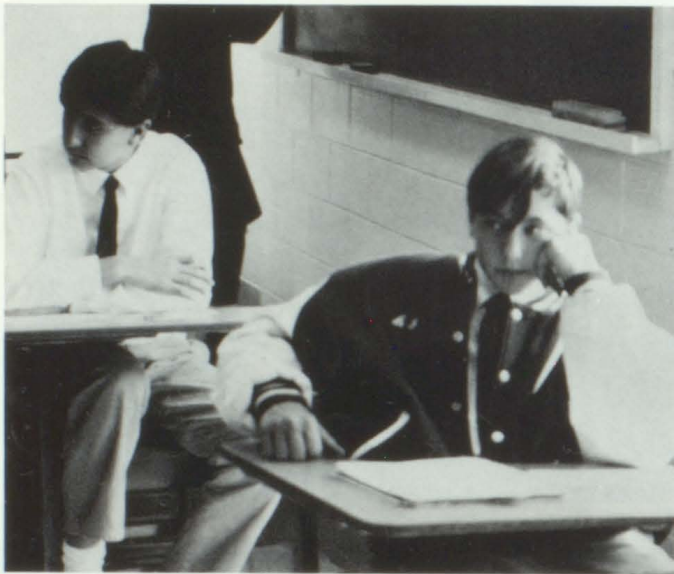

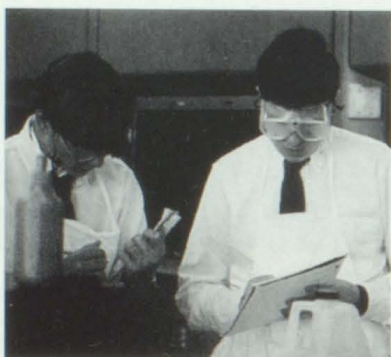
## Academics

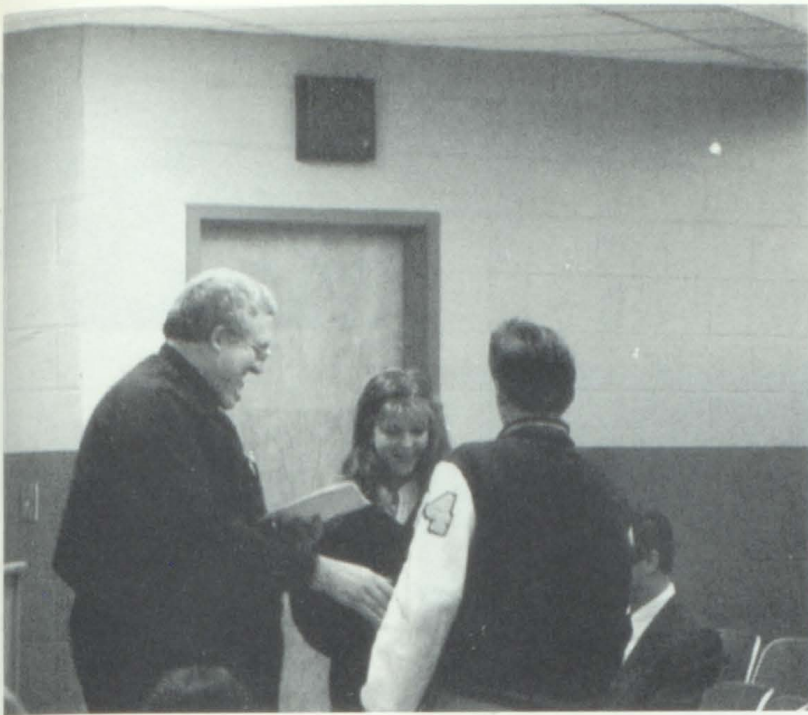

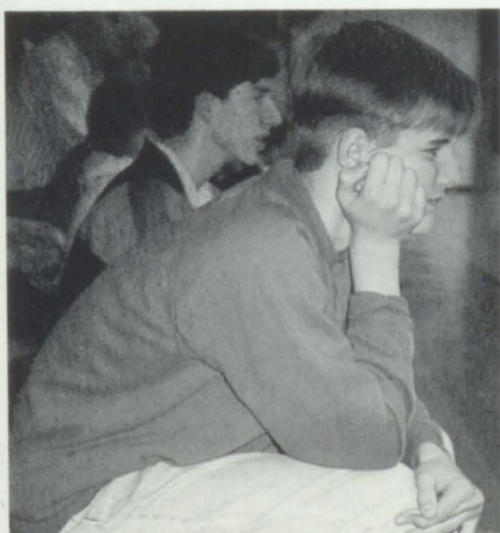


# at S.P.B.
