For all the students at Fairview, the FAIRVIEWER recorded events of the school and reflected student opinion.





Endeavoring to care for the poor, Student Council gathered clothing to send to needy families. This and other worthy projects expanded the influence of our Student Council this year.






Future Farmers of America Builds Community Leaders

This year the Key Club, under the direction of Coach Garland Gudger, was honored by having a member elected as state lieutenant governor and another as district treasurer.







Everyone is inspired to work diligently because the 4-H'ers compete with each other for awards at the end of the year.




