




Beautiful People, Too


To Remember

The transition - from child, to teenager, to adult - is full of happiness and sorrow, joy and equal pain, as students strive to achieve maturity.





Joe Shults






Mrs. Jean Thorne






Math Teachers


Librarians


Student Council plays "Santa Claus"


Organization Snapshots

Susan Cooley was selected by a combined vote of the football and basketball players as Athletic Sweetheart. Susan has been a varsity cheerleader for three years.


